THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA)
ANNOUNCES THE AVAILABILITY OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE RECORD FOR THE
WAYMIRE DRUM VAPOR INTRUSION SITE

In August of 2019, EPA was requested by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board to conduct a removal action at the Waymire Drum Vapor Intrusion site (site) at 7702 Maie Ave in Los Angeles, California. The soil at the site is contaminated with the chemicals commonly used in industrial-cleaning processes: tetrachloroethene (PCE), trichloroethene (TCE) and vinyl chloride (VC). It is unclear how the soil became contaminated but, beginning in the 1920s the site was used as a drum-cleaning facility and later as various auto body salvaging companies. These chemicals can migrate as a vapor from the soil into the indoor air of buildings, posing a threat to public health. This is known as "vapor intrusion." In September 2019, EPA began installing vapor intrusion mitigation systems in affected residential and commercial buildings surrounding the 7702 Maie Avenue property.
