Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act, 16 U.S.C. § 668(a)  50 C.F.R. Part 22, Subpart A	Applicable	Prohibits anyone, without a permit issued by the Secretary of the Interior, from 'taking' bald or golden eagles, including their parts (including feathers), nests, or eggs. It also prohibits disturbing or agitating or bothering a bald or golden eagle to a degree that causes, or is likely to cause, based on the best scientific information available, 1) injury to an eagle, 2) a decrease in its productivity, by substantially interfering with normal breeding, feeding, or sheltering behavior, or 3) nest abandonment, by substantially interfering with normal breeding, feeding, or sheltering behavior. 50 C.F.R. Part 22.6	BLM biologist conducted a nest assessment for the nest located .42 miles from the site and determined there would not be any impacts to nesting or foraging habitat.		✓
