



## Trowbridge Dam Cleanup Update – September 2022



This is an update on the cleanup of PCB contamination along the Kalamazoo River. Final sampling was completed this summer and the removal of contaminated sediments should start next year (2023).

Crews are now working on access for equipment down to the river off of 24<sup>th</sup> Street at 109<sup>th</sup>. We have permission from the owner, and the farmland off 24<sup>th</sup> Street is private property, so please keep out of this area.

Over the next couple months, trucks will bring in sand, rock, heavy, equipment and other materials. You may also see or hear heavy equipment moving around down by the river. We put up orange signs up to remind you of potentially slow moving trucks coming in and out of our entrance off 24<sup>th</sup> Street.

We asked trucks to keep to the posted speed limits for safety and dust control. **If you see speeding or reckless driving, please contact us right away.**

The boat launch and kayak/canoe portage remains open at 26<sup>th</sup> Street.
