

Saturday, April 1, 2023, 11:30 a.m. Update:

Unified Command provides the following update on the 3/30/23 train derailment in Raymond, Minnesota.

- The tracks returned to service and the first train traversed the area early morning April 1, 2023.
- Restoration of the site will continue for several days.
- Derailed and damaged tank cars of remaining ethanol and corn syrup are being transloaded into frac tanks.
- Oversight was transitioned to the state. EPA will continue to support the response remotely and assist the state as needed.
- BNSF air monitoring at the work site continued overnight and has not found any particulate matter or volatile organic compound levels of concern.
